Responsive to national and international news and current affairs.

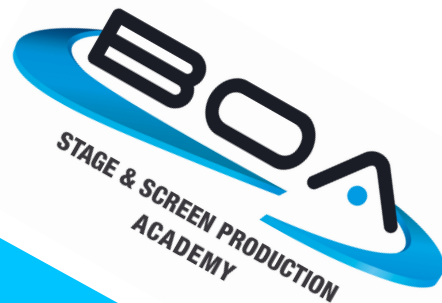
Teaching Tuesday
